WESTERN STATES CORVETTE COUNCIL

Congratulations, Corvette Club of Utah, for our decision to once again be a part of the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC). In the last issue of the Vette Gazette I described the process by which our club became a non-voting participant with WSCC. Speaking with some of our club's veteran members, the WSCC president Rob Weaver, and WSCC NCM Ambassador Buzz Marston, I learned that our club was a full Voting Member club back in the 1960's and 70's. I also learned that CCU hosted the 1976 WSCC National Convention. John Kennedy was our club president at that time. In Rob Weaver's words,

"The Convention was a memorable event. We had an autocross and drag racing at the Bonneville Raceway Park, a gimmick rally, tricycle racing and a Concours car show. The site was the Hilton in Salt Lake City on West 5th South. The Convention ran from July 4th-9th . . . "

It is not uncommon to ask, "What is the Western States Corvette Council, and why should I belong?" Basically, the council is nothing more than a collection of clubs who have decided that they are interested in sharing common events and that there are benefits to operating as a group. The Board, and all the members are all volunteers, and the Council is a non-profit organization. Corvette club members sign up individually as a dues paying member of WSCC, and in doing so receive the quarterly journal Redline and . . . "Every member has the opportunity to participate in the council events, make new friends, and exchange ideas on our basic interest, the Corvette." With those few comments, let me now bring you all up to date on some interesting new information that I have received from the WSCC Board. I received a note from our buddy Buzz Marston a couple of weeks ago while he was in Bowling Green, KY attending the Fourth Quarter Board meeting. Buzz explained that one of the topics was the 2007 American Le Mans Series (ALMS) racing schedule. As we know, Miller Motorsports Park is scheduled to host the 5th race of the season over the weekend of May 19. In Buzz's words, CCU is "on for the dance." Our Corvette Club of Utah will be invited to again join with Chevrolet and the National Corvette Museum in hosting the Chevy Presents Corvette Corral. Buzz also noted that the 2007 race will be under the lights – a night race. The most recent issue of *Redline* magazine made several complementary notations toward our CCU, which included the statement that "CCU was a member of WSCC back in the 60's and 70's and they are "the" club in Utah." Well, certainly we knew that, oh yeah! So, that is why CCU will be invited to host the corral again. We are the Man, so to speak.

Some CCU members may have already heard that there is a 2009 National Corvette Caravan being planned again to go back to Bowling Green. From the comments in Redline, Salt Lake City will be a stoppingoff point for the east bound Corvette caravans. Do you remember 2003? It looks like its coming again, and CCU will be asked to take a major roll. Who is up for another awesome Road Trip? There isn't much word out yet about this caravan, but you can watch the web site at http://www.nationalcorvettecaravan.com for updates.



Those who attended the ALMS race at MMP last July, and especially our CCU members who worked the corral, will remember our congenial racing hero Ron Fellows. Well, Ron can add another chevron to his sleeve because he was again selected by the fans, for the third year in a row, as the

"Most Popular Driver" in ALMS. Anyone who had the opportunity to talk with Ron, one on one as I did, knows what a down to Earth, regular guy he is. And when he gets behind the wheel of that awe-inspiring C6.R racing Corvette he becomes a road animal. I know that I am not alone in looking forward to next year's ALMS race and getting more great photo opportunities with Ron, his partner Johnny O'Connell, and the two Olli's at the race in May.

Lastly, our Corvette Racing Team continued its tradition of achievement in 2006 when it wrapped up this 50th Anniversary in international road racing by sweeping the American Le Mans Series manufacturers, drivers and team championships. The season came to its conclusion under the lights at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca in October. What an inspiring heritage we all have to cling to. Watch for much more to come.

Jan Bush, who did such a fantastic job with these awards last year, has volunteered to do the again. Let's come up with lots of good awards.



Following the conclusion of the 2006 American Le Mans Series and the SCCA SPEED World Challenge Championships at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca on Oct. 21-22, GM's factory road racing teams won special recognition in post-season award ceremonies.

Corvette Racing driver Ron Fellows was voted the Most Popular Driver in the ALMS, Corvette Racing's Dan Binks was honored as the GT1 Crew Chief of the Year, and Team Cadillac program manager Dave Spitzer was awarded the prestigious Jim Cook Memorial Trophy. Established in 2003, the ALMS Most Popular Driver award is determined by the fans in online voting. Fellows won the award for an unprecedented third year in a row. "It's a great honor to win this award again," said Fellows. "When you receive awards that are voted on by fans, they're hugely flattering. I want to express my sincere thanks to the fans." CORVETTE HISTORY

THE GENERAL'S TOYBOX

SEPTEMBER 1953

A story the <u>St. Louis Post Dispatch</u> carried a very interesting headline on the "locals" page. It read, "Chevrolet to Make Plastic Cars Here."

In June of 1953, production of a new car called the Corvette began next to the GM plant on Van Slyke Road in Flint, MI. The location offered skilled labor and available production space and it was close to key departments. But it was clear from the beginning that if the car survived the first year, the little plant on Van Slyke Road was to be a temporary location.

As early as March of 1953, St Louis Plant Manager, William Mosher was told to get ready for this new car and start looking for production space. Mosher sent a team to the Flint facility and told them to observe the start up of the Corvette line. They took detailed notes and quickly developed an assembly layout.

The little plant in Flint ended production on December 24th and began in earnest in St. Louis, just four days later on the 28th and would continue until 1981 when production moved to Bowling Green, KY.
