Auto Racing Facts

How fast could you drive a car in the old days? The first auto race in the U.S. was held in Chicago on Thanksgiving Day, 1895. It was a 50-mile race, and the winning car, driven by famous inventor, Frank Duryea, traveled at the average speed of 7 ½ miles per hour.

One of the unusual auto races of all time was the 1952 Florida Stock Car Championship. A car was in first place near the end of the race when its wheels came off. The car flipped over, but crossed the finish line first – skidding on its top across the line.

What's the fastest a car has even gone on land? The record was set in 1997 when a jet-powered car went 764 mph on Nevada's Black Rock Desert – going faster than the speed of sound.

The longest skid marks ever made by a car were by Craig Breedlove's jet-powered car after it went out of control at the Bonneville Salt Flats in 1964. The skid marks were nearly six miles long.

There was a special duration auto race in Paris in 1933 that lasted 133 days, from March to July. At the end of the race, the drivers had covered more than 185,000 miles.



2019 National Corvette Caravan

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the anniversary celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the next event is slated for Labor Day Weekend 2019 and will mark the Museum's 25th Anniversary. Leading the charge will be Jeffrey Duda of Hainesport, NJ, a Lifetime Member of the Museum and previous cocaptain of the New Jersey 2014 and 2009 Caravans.

The 6th National Corvette Caravan is slated for August 28-31, 2019. Regional caravans will form and join other caravans as they travel across the United States to meet in Bowling Green, Kentucky for four days of festivities at the National Corvette Museum. An event such as this requires years of planning and coordinating. All help is appreciated! Don Herzer, Publications Director for the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC) who served as Captain of the NorCal section of the 2014 Caravan, has been asked to to be the Captain for 2019.

He has elected to give our section a nickname - Pacific Central Corvette

Caravan – which is easily further shortened to Pacific Central and PCCC. This is much less cumbersome than listing the whole three states. Also, if it is shortened to NorCal (as done in 2014), then N. Nevada and Utah feel left out.

Please note that even if you are not going all the way to Bowling Green, you are welcome to join in the Caravan out of CA as far as you like, or just join us at the launch site (TBD), as many have done in the past.

At this point, he is planning on pretty much replicating the route that he took in 2014. If you have any thoughts/suggestions on that please let him know.

Registration for both the Caravan and the festivities are not open at this time. Note that the 2019 Corvette Caravan and the NCM 25th Anniversary are two separate events, each with their own registration, which is expected to be available on the NCM web site starting (TBD).

He will be working on blocking sets of rooms at hotels along the route, but do not expect registration to be available until approximately fall of 2018. He will be compiling all this and much more into a Route Book that will be available to registered participants in Spring 2019.

Corvette Racing at Le Mans

DETROIT (May 9, 2017) – Corvette Racing's 18th consecutive appearance at the 24 Hours of Le Mans will feature a lineup of six drivers, each with victories in the famed French endurance event. In addition to full-season drivers Antonio Garcia, Jan Magnussen, Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner, Corvette Racing adds Jordan Taylor and Marcel Fässler to its roster for the June 17-18 race with a pair of Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.Rs for the GTE Pro class.

The group has a combined 18 victories at Le Mans – an impressive number to go along with Corvette Racing's eight class triumphs since 2001. The team will arrive at Le Mans with three straight victories in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship and the lead in Manufacturer's, Driver's and Team points for the GT Le Mans (GTLM) class.

"This represents one of the strongest lineups Corvette Racing has fielded for the 24 Hours of Le Mans," said Mark Kent, Chevrolet Director of Motorsports Competition. "Just like our full-season lineup, Jordan and Marcel have proven themselves repeatedly on the biggest stages in sports car racing. We are confident they help give us the best possible chance to win Le Mans for the ninth time."

Taylor has been part of Corvette Racing's Le Mans program since 2012 and was part of the winning effort in 2015 alongside Gavin and Milner. For 2017, he will reunite with Garcia and Magnussen in the No. 63 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R; the trio placed second in GTE Pro together in 2014.

Taylor and brother Ricky have swept all four IMSA events this year with their Wayne Taylor Racing Cadillac DPi-V.R prototype including the Rolex 24 At Daytona and Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring.

Fässler, who returns to the No. 64 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R, won each of those two races in 2016 with Corvette Racing alongside Gavin and Milner. Those victories helped Corvette Racing sweep the GTLM Championships a season ago. The trio drove together

again at both Florida events again in 2017.

A three-time overall winner at Le Mans, Fässler also has two additional podium finishes. He drove for Corvette Racing in Chevrolet's final GT1 race at Le Mans in 2009, but that entry was forced to retire while leading.

Both Taylor and Fässler are part of a pre-Le Mans test this week at Road America in Elkhart Lake, Wisc.

Corvette Racing's next event is the 24 Hours of Le Mans on June 17-18 from Le Mans, France. It returns to IMSA competition for the Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen on July 2.

2017 Total Eclipse Cruise (Aug 21st)

On Monday, August 21st we will be departing the Flying J in Willard (600 W 750 N) (Willard Bay North Exit on I-15) promptly at 6:00 AM to view the total eclipse of the sun. We will travel North on I-15 to Idaho Falls, ID and then US-20 to Rexburg, ID. On the University Blvd Exit, there is an Applebee's with a large parking lot which is where I plan to stop and view the eclipse. The eclipse will start at 10:30 AM with totality expected between 11:24 AM and 11:36 AM. Following the eclipse, we will eat lunch at Applebee's before heading home.

This is a big event and there will be lots of people and traffic present. Please plan on being flexible as we deal with the crowds. We may have to use another viewing area. The initial plan was to make this an overnight trip, but there are no motels available within 40 miles and gouging is occurring with the Super 8 in Rexberg asking for over \$500 for their remaining room. So this will be a day trip. If traffic permits, we will stop at Blackfoot and see the Spud Museum while we are up there.

If the weather is forecasted to be cloudy or raining, this trip will be cancelled. We will send a club wide email the day before (Sunday, August 20th) if it is cancelled.
