Corvette Spy Car On Display

It's not unusual to see a Corvette in an action, suspense or spy movie... True Lies, 2 Fast 2 Furious, Fast Five, XXX, Con Air, Rush Hour, Along Came a Spider... the list goes on. But what about using a Corvette in a real-life spy operation? Such is the case for a 2006 Black Z06 that is now displayed in the National Corvette Museum's Skydome.

Owner Naveed Jamali (FBI code name Green Kryptonite) of New York City spent three years working as a double agent for the FBI against the GRU (Russian military intelligence) and his Corvette was one of his personal cars used in counter-intelligence operations. "Looking back,

one encounter with the Russians really stands out. They confused my Corvette with a Mustang," Naveed chuckles. "I was really offended that they'd get the two confused and I'm sure they could hear the annoyance in my voice!"

His story is the subject of his book "How to Catch a Russian Spy" (available for purchase through the Corvette Store) and the rights for a movie were purchased by 20th Century Fox. You can check out an excerpt from the book on Jalopnik here.

But how did the Corvette make its way to the Museum for display? Especially since Naveed had sold the car? "When I sold the car in 2009, I didn't think twice about it," he said. "When I wrote the book, one of the most common questions was, 'Do you still have the Corvette?' or 'Can I get a photo with the Corvette?' or 'Can I ride in the Corvette?' So I decided to seek it out."

Naveed says it took awhile to track down his old car, and once he did, before he could buy it, it sold to someone else. He ended up finally purchasing the Corvette back in November, 2015 – just a month before it came to the Museum for display. Naveed laughs, "I'm the 2nd owner and the 6th owner of the car."



The car arrived for display and the end of December and will be on the floor through June 1, 2016. "I've been a big fan of the Corvette Museum for a very long time, and I thought this was such a unique car, what better place to display it than where it was born?" Of course, encouragement from some folks at Jalopnik to reach out to us didn't hurt, either!

Prior to owning the 2006 Z06 Naveed owned a C5 Z06 – a 2003 Quicksilver, which was the 50th Anniversary year for Corvette. That was the car he owned when he first visited the Museum for the C5 Bash – an event he's hoping to attend April 28-30 to share the story behind the car and do a book signing. "I'm really hoping to attend the Bash and am working to clear my schedule to make that happen."

Corvette Racing Adds Briscoe, Pagenaud to Driver Lineup

Open-wheel standouts to drive Corvette C7.Rs at Daytona, Sebring

- Aussie Briscoe continues with Corvette Racing
- Frenchman Pagenaud to get first opportunity to drive Corvette C7.R
- Duo to join full-season roster of drivers at Roar Before the 24

DETROIT - Corvette Racing will head into the opening round of the IMSA TUDOR United SportsCar Championship with an impressive GTLM driver lineup for North America's premier endurance race. Ryan Briscoe returns to the Corvette Racing camp for the second straight year while Simon Pagenaud will make his debut with the team at Daytona International Speedway. Briscoe will share driving duties of the No. 3 Corvette C7.R with Jan Magnussen and Antonio Garcia, and Pagenaud will join Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner in the No. 4 C7.R at the annual Roar Before the 24 starting Jan. 9th. The Roar serves as a three-day test ahead of the 53rd Rolex 24 At Daytona and the start of the TUDOR Championship. In addition, Briscoe and Pagenaud will join the Corvette C7.R team at Sebring.

"Corvette Racing's driver lineup for the Daytona and Sebring races represents a highly talented collection of drivers who are intensely focused on working together toward the common goal of winning," said Mark Kent, Director, Chevrolet Racing. "Both Ryan and Simon are world-class drivers who know the kind of preparation, patience and skill needed to succeed in the top levels of endurance sports-car racing."

Both Briscoe and Pagenaud are known for their successes in both open-wheel and sports car racing. Briscoe appeared in three events for Corvette Racing in 2014 - Daytona, Sebring and Petit Le Mans at Road Atlanta. The Aussie also made 18 stars in the Verizon INDYCAR Series with one top-five finish and 10 top-10s. He has seven IndyCar victories to his credit to go along with nine prototype wins in the American Le Mans Series.


Pagenaud also boasts a number of victories in both open-wheel and prototype competition. While competing in the IndyCar series, he won two races in 2013 and 2014, and finished third in the 2013 IndyCar championship.

Pagenaud signed with Team Penske and will drive a Chevrolet V6-powered IndyCar for the 2015 season. Previously, he spent four seasons in ALMS prototypes with nine victories as a factory driver.

The 2015 TUDOR United Sports Car Championship begins with the 53rd Rolex 24 at Daytona from Jan. 24-25 at Daytona International Speedway. Live

timing and scoring from both the Roar Before the 24 and Rolex 24 at Daytona will be available at imsa.com.





RYAN BRISCOE, NO. 3 CORVETTE RACING CORVETTE C7.R

"It's such a massive honor to be a part of the Corvette Racing program. To come back this year and be a part of the team for the endurance events, I'm really excited. We're hoping the pace and everything is there that we need to have to win with one of the Corvettes. We really were strong last year and had a little bad luck. Everyone on the team is extremely hungry and I'm really looking forward to it."

"It was definitely a new experience for me last year to be racing in the GT class. I thought it went really well. The team brought me on and gave me all the tools I needed to get up to speed and feel comfortable with the racecar. I feel like it's a comfortable pairing with Antonio and Jan. I really felt like I got really good track time and could put down really good lap times to hold my own. Before you get into it, you really don't know how it's going to go. You just want to do your best."

SIMON PAGENAUD, NO. 4 CORVETTE RACING, CORVETTE C7.R

"Corvette is definitely an icon in American racing and as an American sports car. When I was racing with for another manufacturer, I always noticed the presence of the Corvette and Chevrolet fans. I've always said that Corvette Racing is a proper program - well put together with a very impressive presentation, great drivers and a fantastic team. The results speak for themselves. It's great to be part of it now. It is definitely a very different experience compared to prototypes but I have some good experience in GT cars. I look forward to now being part of the family by driving for Chevrolet and Corvette Racing. The Corvette C7.R is a beautiful piece of machinery with a lot of high-tech development. It's a great platform for the development of road cars and supercars."

"Thanks to Chevrolet for the opportunity, and of course thanks to Roger Penske and Tim Cindric in allowing me to be available. With this type of opportunity where you have the chance to go and run in a different category with a car and team that can win, it's exciting and gets you very motivated. I really want to win Daytona. If we can do that with Chevrolet and Corvette Racing, I'll be super excited and over the moon."


