## Proposed Bylaw Change Passes

A proposed ByLaw Change was presented, voted upon, and passed at the Dec 2017 Membership Meeting. This change removes the point system for officer eligibility and puts in place a 50% attendance requirement at points events to be eligible to run for President. It also allows the officers to appoint an officer for a vacant officer position subject to approval by a consenting vote of 2/3 club majority at a membership meeting.

## CORVETTE HISTORY

Corvette Profile: The 1957 Production Racer

In the performance section of the National Corvette Museum, hundreds of thousands of visitors every year see examples of Corvette racing throughout the years.

One of the earliest examples of Corvette racing, and one that is often overlooked due to how stock the racer looks cosmetically, is the 1957 #4 fuel injected Corvette.

## 2019 National Corvette Caravan

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the anniversary celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the next event is slated for Labor Day Weekend 2019 and will mark the Museum's 25th Anniversary. Leading the charge will be Jeffrey Duda of Hainesport, NJ, a Lifetime Member of the Museum and previous co-captain of the New Jersey 2014 and 2009 Caravans.

The 6th National Corvette Caravan is slated for August 28-31, 2019. Regional caravans will form and join other caravans as they travel across the United States to meet in Bowling Green, Kentucky for four days of festivities at the National Corvette Museum. An event such as this requires years of planning and coordinating. All help is appreciated! Don Herzer, Publications Director for the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC) who served as Captain of the NorCal section of the 2014 Caravan, has been asked to to be our Captain for 2019.

He has elected to give our section a nickname – Pacific Central Corvette Caravan – which is easily further shortened to Pacific Central and PCCC.

This is much less cumbersome than listing the whole three states. Also, if it is shortened to NorCal (as done in 2014), then N. Nevada and Utah feel left out.

He will be working on blocking sets of rooms at hotels along the route, but don't expect registration to be available until approximately fall of 2018.

He will be compiling all this and much more into a Route Book that will be available to registered participants Spring 2019.

You can help promote the Caravan by decorating your car with a window sticker, flag(s), and/or a rear window "Follow Me To Bowling Green" decal – all available from Don. Contact Don for pricing/availability.

If you would like to volunteer to help him in this venture, he would welcome that. He will also be looking for sponsors to help defray some of the costs.

What can you expect from the 2019 National Corvette Caravan:

Registration for the caravan will occur on-line at the National Corvette Museum (NCM) website. If you are not a member of NCM, you will have to join NCM as part of the registration process. We will send out a notice when it's time to register.

Go to the Corvette Caravan Facebook page and join the group. This is how you will receive information regarding the caravan from NCM and our Captain.

Sign-up for a Corvette Factory Tour on the Thursday or Friday of the week that we will be at the NCM. This is one of the highlights during the caravan. These go fast so sign-up early. The NCM website has a link to the factory tour reservations page.

Bob Clayton and Bob Tillotson will be the CCU Co-Captains for the CCU portion of the caravan. They will share the planning and and take turns leading CCU to and from the NCM.

## **The Caravan Going To Route:**

Contrary to his initial posting, he has decided against replicating the 2014 itinerary. Instead we will take a new route favoring scenic less travelled roads, with fun activities and visits to unique places along the way. He is still ironing out the details, but here is a rough outline:

Thursday, Aug 22nd - We will launch in the morning on somewhere in the Fairfield area and take highway 50 through the Sierra, arriving in Carson City in time for lunch and maybe other activities, and then head to **Fallon, NV** for other activities and spend the night.

Friday, Aug 23rd - We will travel to **Salina, UT** along the Loneliest Highway in the US, with fun activities TBD.

Saturday Aug 24th - (CCU - Bob T) Tentatively set to end in **Estes Park, CO**, Traveling through Rocky Mt. National Park. CCU will join the Caravan on this morning for their departure out of Salina, UT.

Sunday Aug 25th - (CCU - Bob C) Activities around Golden, CO. Overnight in **Fort Morgan, CO**.

Monday Aug 26th - (CCU - Bob T) End up in **St. Joseph, MO**.

Tuesday Aug 27th - (CCU - Bob C) Get to **Effingham, IL** and visit Mid-America.

Wednesday Aug 28th - (CCU - Bob T) On to **Bowling Green**. We will link up with the So. CA section before entering Bowling Green so there will be a combined CA/NV group entering the NCM.

If you are serious about going on this section of the Caravan, please send Don an email so he can keep you informed about lodging and optional activities that he may set up.

About a year out, a list of hotels will be released. CCU will be using these hotels for the trip to the museum. You can choose to start with the caravan in California if you want to do US-50 across California and Nevada.

## **At the Museum:**

Thursday, Aug 29th thru Saturday Aug 31st - While at the NCM, we will be staying in Bowling Green. At the present time, all of the hotels that allow blocking of rooms are blocked out. Reservations will open up 52 weeks prior to our stay. We will provide a list of hotels within a one block area at that time. The primary hotel will be a Best Western.

## **The Caravan Return Route:**

The return route will be Route 66 from Chicago to Santa Monica. A list of hotels will be released about a year out. We are still ironing out the details, but here is a rough outline.

Sunday, Sep 1st - (CCU- Bob T) Chicago and Overnight in Joilet, IL. Visit the start of Route 66 and visit some attractions on Lakeshore Drive.

Monday, Sep 2nd - (CCU - Bob C) St Louis, MO. Drive the Illinois portion of Route 66 and visit the arch.

Tuesday, Sep 3rd - (CCU - Bob T) Springfield, MO. Drive the Missouri portion of Route 66 and take in a show in Branson, Mo.

Wednesday, Sep 4th - (CCU - Bob C) Clinton, OK. Drive the Kansas and Oklahoma portion of Route 66.

Thursday, Sep 5th - (CCU - Bob T) Albuquerque, NM. Stop at the Big Texan and Cadillac Ranch in Amarillo, TX.

Friday, Sep 6th - (CCU - Bob C) Kingman, AZ. Stop at Williams and Seligman.

Saturday, Sep 7th - (CCU - Bob C) Santa Monica, CA. Drive California Route 66 through Barstow and then stay overnight on Route 66 in Rancho Cucamonga, Ca.

Sunday, Sep 8th - (CCU - Bob C) Mesquite, NV. Overnight stop on the way back to Salt Lake City.

# **CORVETTE RACING AT DAYTONA: Mistake-Free Run to Start 20th Season**

**DETROIT** (Jan. 28, 2018) – Corvette Racing turned in a mistake-free run with both its Chevrolet Corvette C7.Rs to post third- and fourth-place class finishes in the Rolex 24 At Daytona to open the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. The result was a positive effort as Corvette Racing begins its 20th season of competition.

Antonio Garcia, class pole-winner Jan Magnussen and Mike Rockenfeller placed third in the GT Le Mans (GTLM) category with their No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R. It is the second Rolex 24 podium for the trio after they finished second two years ago, and it gives Garcia and Magnussen positive momentum as they seek to defend their GTLM Driver Championship from last year.

Chevrolet and the Corvette Racing team swept the GTLM Manufacturer, Driver and Team titles for the second straight year in 2017. Sunday's results laid the groundwork for another strong challenge for the IMSA season.

In the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R, the trio of Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Marcel Fässler placed fourth and had a similarly clean run throughout Saturday and Sunday. Either Corvette Racing entry likely would have claimed victory in any other season, given that neither Corvette went off-track or made a mistake. It's a hallmark of the program, which has won 106 races around the world, 12 Manufacturer and Team championships, and 11 Driver titles during its years in IMSA.

The next event for Corvette Racing is the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring Fueled by Fresh from Florida on March 15-17 at Sebring International Raceway.

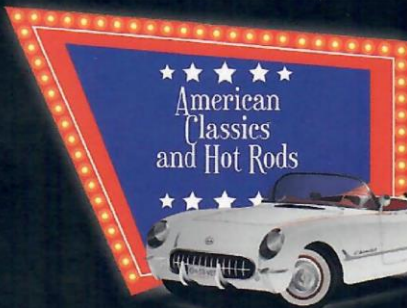
