2018 Charity – Utah Food Bank

Our 2018 Charity – The Utah Food Bank A Goal and a Challenge

When members of our club met with representatives of the Utah Food Bank earlier this year to give them our collected donations from last year, they were shown both the need and the opportunities for giving that are in some of our Salt Lake communities.

At the next Member's Meeting, those members spoke about what they had learned; for example, that pet food is obtained and given to those (usually elderly) individuals who cannot afford it – those animals may be the only companionship that these older people have.

And the children – they learned, and shared with us, that many children's last meal for the week is Friday's school lunch; their next meal is Monday's school breakfast. These kids, for reasons beyond their ability to control, do not have the food that you and I take for granted. Many come from immigrant families, others from generational poverty, where poor parental choices mean children suffer.

They learned, and shared with us, that The Utah Food Bank has a program that brings food to these impoverished areas of the Salt Lake Valley. They bring trucks to the schools so that kids can have food to eat on the weekend. John Forbes showed us a video (here is the link: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=taLp71WH3ZM>) which shows these young kids being so grateful to receive help.

To sponsor a school in one of these areas is \$5,000. That provides a year's worth of food to the elementary school kids and their families. Because the Food Bank can turn one of our dollars into \$7 dollars, due to their buying power, the money is much appreciated, and well spent.

Instead of giving some money to the Utah Food Bank, our goal and challenge is to raise \$5,000 to sponsor a school. I'm happy to report that we are over half way there! We have received generously from our members so far. We still have work to do.

Once the money is raised, we will be asked to donate a little of our time,

as a few of us will be able to help pass out food to the children in our school when the truck comes. Imagine what that will feel like to see for yourself the joy and relief that you bring to these little ones!

A friend of mine, who teaches elementary school, told me once that one of the hardest parts of her job emotionally is to see children, who, because of circumstances beyond their control, already have limited choices in life. Already, at young ages, they have obstacles that may/do limit their abilities later in life.

Let's change that. We CAN change these children's lives, and opportunities for the better, simply by making sure they can focus on learning and not their empty bellies.

Please contribute to our charity this year.

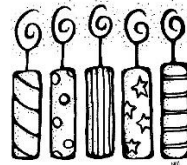

CORVETTE RACING AT SEBRING: Seeking to Conquer the Bumps Once Again

DETROIT (March 13, 2018) – In its 19-plus years of competition, Corvette Racing has racked up more victories than any team in IMSA history. Those 98 victories have come on some of America's classic road courses with 11 at the famed Sebring International Raceway. That's where Corvette Racing returns for the 20th time in search of a fourth consecutive victory in the Mobil 1 Twelve Hours of Sebring.

This year's running will be 20th straight appearance at Sebring for Corvette Racing – an odyssey that covers more than 11,000 laps and 40,000 miles and three generations of Corvette race cars. The team will add to that total when it fields its two Chevrolet Corvette C7.Rs in the 66th annual running of America's oldest sports car race. The 12 Hours is the second race of the 2018 IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship. It also is the 200th event all-time for Corvette Racing.

Sebring success has come often for Corvette Racing with all 11 of its victories have come in the last 16 years. The roster of drivers – Antonio Garcia, Jan Magnussen and Mike Rockenfeller in the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Corvette C7.R; and Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Marcel Fässler in the No. 4 Corvette – have combined for 19 victories in the 12 Hours.

Corvette Racing is on a three-race GT Le Mans (GTLM) class win streak at Sebring, and another victory this weekend will mark the second time that the program has scored four straight class victories... the last coming from 2006-09. The team also won three in a row from 2002-04. It extended Chevrolet's record to 38 Sebring victories for the brand.

The two Corvettes and Chevrolet sit second in the GTLM Championship following the first race of the year. Garcia, Magnussen and Rockenfeller finished third in January's Rolex 24 At Daytona with Gavin, Milner and Fässler in fourth. Both Corvettes ran flawless races – doing so again will go a long way to making it a dozen Sebring wins. Copyright © 2017 [Corvette Racing](#). All rights reserved.

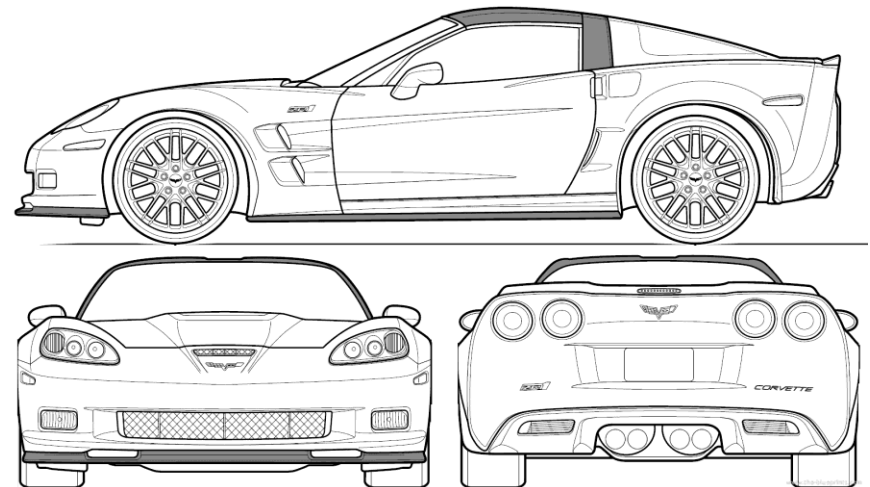

If you are not a member of NCM, you will have to join NCM as part of the registration process. We will send out a notice when it's time to register.

- Go to the Corvette Caravan Facebook page and join the group. This is how you will receive information regarding the caravan from NCM and our Captain.
- Sign-up for a Corvette Factory Tour on the Thursday or Friday of the week that we will be at the NCM. This is one of the highlights during the caravan. These go fast so sign-up early. The NCM website has a link to the factory tour reservations page.

Bob Clayton and Bob Tillotson will be the CCU Co-Captains for the CCU portion of the caravan. They will share in the planning and take turns leading CCU to and from the NCM.

The Caravan Going To Route

Contrary to his initial posting, he has decided against replicating the 2014 itinerary. Instead we will take a new route favoring scenic less travelled roads, with fun activities and visits to unique places along the way. He is still ironing out the details, but here is a rough outline:

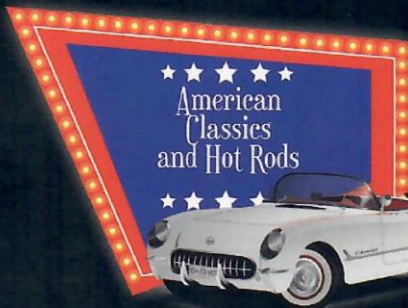
