

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car. culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the anniversary celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the next event is slated for Labor Day Weekend 2019 and will mark the Museum's 25th Anniversary. Don Herzer, Publications Director for the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC) who served as Captain of the NorCal section of the 2014 Caravan, has been asked to be our Captain for 2019.

He has elected to give our section a nickname – Pacific Central Corvette Caravan – which is easily further shortened to Pacific Central and PCCC.

CORVETTE RACING AT ROAD ATLANTA: GTLM Title for Garcia, Magnussen

Gavin, Milner, Fässler second in Petit Le Mans on drama-filled day

BRASELTON, Ga. (Oct. 13, 2018) – Corvette Racing's Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen won their second straight IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship GT Le Mans (GTLM) Driver title Saturday, and in true Corvette Racing fashion it was a team effort.

Oliver Gavin, Tommy Milner and Marcel Fässler placed second in class at Road Atlanta's 10-hour Petit Le Mans in the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R to close Corvette Racing's 20th season of competition in IMSA. Garcia, Magnussen and Fässler codrove the No. 3 Corvette to an eighth-place finish – a result good enough to secure the GTLM Driver and Team championships.

It is the 12th Driver Championship for Corvette Racing and 13th Team title in the program's 20-year history.

"Congratulations to Antonio, Jan and the No. 3 Corvette C7.R team on clinching the GTLM Driver Championship. This team never gave up all season to deliver our 12th Driver title for Corvette Racing over 20 seasons of competition," said Mark Reuss, GM Executive Vice President and President Global Product Group and Cadillac, "And congratulations to Corvette Racing and Pratt & Miller on their 13th Team Championship. They prepared a race car that delivered consistent performance and that great combination of power, durability and efficiency."

Both Corvettes showed racewinning pace throughout the day and into the night as both cars led multiple times in the 10 hours. But pitwork ultimately proved to play a huge role. The No. 4 pit crew got Milner out ahead of the No. 3 Corvette's lone remaining championship contender on his final pit stop with 48 minutes to go. That was only half the story, however.

The No. 3 Corvette crew needed just five-and-a-half minutes to repair its C7.R after a crash with Garcia at the wheel following a pit stop with less than three hours to go. Among other items, the crew replaced the Corvette's nose, front fender and engine floor in lightning quick speed to keep the No. 3 C7.R in the race and in the championship hunt.

At that point, the focus turned to the No. 4 Corvette. Gavin, Milner and Fässler – who drove both Corvette entries in the race – fought and clawed their way to a position where Milner could pressure the sister car's championship challenger late. The team's effort proved even more important as the No. 4 Corvette went from fifth to third in the final GTLM Driver and Team standings.

Although Corvette Racing's IMSA season is complete, there is one more race left in 2018. Corvette Racing will contest the FIA World Endurance Championship's Six Hours of Shanghai on Nov. 16-18.

ANTONIO GARCIA, NO. 3 MOBIL 1/SiriusXM CHEVROLET CORVETTE C7.R – GTLM DRIVER CHAMPION: "It was definitely a tough race. From Lap 1, I went in the lead and every time I was in the

car I was going for it instead of holding position. It probably went from one of my best races of my career to the most embarrassing moment of my career. But that means Team Chevy and Corvette Racing did all the prep work before this race and allowed us to come back from that. Thank you to the 4 car for keeping the pressure up on the 67 car, which had to go for the win for the (championship) result. That's part of this championship the 4 car keeping the pressure up at the end. I'm very happy. It will take me a little bit to forget that mistake, but I'm very happy for the whole team."

CCU Members at WeatherTech Raceway Laguna Seca

The morning of Wednesday September 5 saw nine Corvettes from CCU head west to join hundreds of Corvette racing enthusiasts at the Corvette Corral and the 12th race of the WeatherTech Sports Car Championship series in Monterey/Salinas, California. After a night's stay in Sparks, NV we left for our lodging in Salinas via South Lake Tahoe taking advantage of some secondary highways through California wine country. We left our hotel early on Friday for the raceway, about a 20 min. drive on Calif. Hwy 68. We were directed to the corral parking area, took our places with the other participants and moseyed to the corral tent. After checking it out folks began to explore the raceway. Time trials and qualifying were going on that day and we could smell the fuel fumes and hot rubber floating across the track but it was the sound, that sound, of high performance race machines punching it down the straightaways and holding on to the edge of traction on the curves that raises the neck hair and sends chills down your body.

After a few hours checking out the auto manufacturers exhibits like the production Ford GT (at a cool price of \$455,000.00), the all carbon fiber Acura NSX and Porsche exhibits it was time to leave for the afternoon's cruise to Carmel and the Pebble Beach 17-Mile Drive. We enjoyed stops by the sea side watching the sea birds and listening to the barking of the Seals while they play and feed among the rocks and surf.

We made a stop at the Lodge at Pebble Beach. It's easy to be bowled over by the beauty of the lawns and the sea not to mention the elegance of the lodge itself. Then, after the cruise it was off to Monterey for a reservation at Bubba Gump Shrimp Co. It was an awesome day. Thanks Scott and Kathi Stanford and Bob Clayton for these activities.

On Saturday the 8th we left early again because that was Parade Lap registration day and only 100 passes are distributed. After registration we settled in at the tables in the corral tent to enjoy presentations and talks from important figures in Corvette racing. Presentations included an autograph session by our race team, Michelin Tire technicians, and Corvette Racing Program Manager Doug Fehan. All of us from CCU had gotten our

parade pass and at 11:00 a.m. we fired up the Vettes and lined up for the experience of a lifetime. With an official track pace car leading the pack, single file, we left the corral, lined up just past turn 5 and headed up the Rahal Straight hill toward the one and only Corkscrew turns. Ask anyone who's done it, the rush is amazing. Try taking the corkscrew at speed if you dare.

We got three complete laps on the Laguna Seca track then it was back to the corral parking. We had a few hours still open to watch the three different classes of cars practice and qualify including our Corvette team C7.Rs. That late morning was the first actual race, the Lamborghini Trofeo race; all cars were Lamborghinis. It was amazing to see these exotics, all performance matched, compete for the trophy and bragging rights. There was a nasty crash at the top of the Corkscrew during this race and the race was red flagged until the debris was cleared.

After a fine day at the track we headed back to our hotel to clean up for dinner at the famous Sardine Factory in Monterey. An unforgettable presentation and glorious food was enjoyed by all. Thanks go to Myrna and Brent Williams for setting up this reservation.

The big race was on Sunday. This was to be the next-to-last WeatherTech Championship race and our Corvette team was neck-n-neck with the Ford GT team. The race was set for that afternoon at 2:05 p.m. and would end at 4:45. So, there were a few hours to enjoy more sights and sounds around the track, visit the many sales venders who were selling everything from race clothing and very cool T-shirts to die cast car models, posters and all sorts of memorabilia. Who could come home without a few cool new Corvette T-shirts? Later, back at the corral we were treated to more technical presentations from the Chevrolet Corvette Engineering team including Kai Spande, Mike Bailey and the Corvette Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter. There was a special appearance of former team driver and sponsor of Spring Mountain Performance Racing School Mr. Ron Fellows himself. Of course, Ron gave autographs too. Hats, shirts and some folks brought in the rocker covers from their cars to be signed by the team as well as Ron Fellows. Where else could you do this? The Corvette Corral experience is something to remember. Just prior to the beginning of the race we all attended the Open Grid Fan Walk. This is where all the attending

race fans can walk among the competing cars, meet the other race teams, take pictures, get autographs and actually touch these amazing high performance race machines including our Corvette C7.R cars and meet the pit crew teams.

As 2:00 p.m. grew near our CCU enthusiasts took to the stands across from the Corvette team pit area along the front straight at the Laguna Seca raceway. From this vantage point all of the race team pits can be seen and we could watch the pit crews work their magic, that magic being so critical to a well performing team. With cameras in hand and ear plugs in place, the sound is unbelievable, the pace car left the track and the race field headed to the green flag and suddenly all hell broke loose. Before the green flag dropped one prototype caught the rear corner of another and carnage ensued. The race start was delayed for 30 minutes but after the delay the big race was on. There are three different classes of cars that compete in the WeatherTech series. There are the Prototypes, they are the fastest, there are the GTLM in which our Corvette C7.Rs compete and there is the GTD class. The three classes all racing at the same time makes for some really interesting driving situations and contributes to the complexity of this Le Mans series. During the 2 hour 45 minutes race there was ample time to walk the track, watch the race machines corner, pass and pursue their rivals on this challenging raceway. We also had time to walk up the famous hill and park ourselves at the Corkscrew to watch the drivers negotiate the complex series of twists and turns down the hill.

At the end of the race and with the usual attrition rate including the failure of both Ford GTs to finish, our No. 3 C7.R driven by Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen placed 3rd in class while our No. 4 Corvette C7.R driven by Oliver Gavin and Tommy Milner placed 5th in class. With the Fords dropping out and the consistent reliability of the Corvettes we were in good position to still win another championship. We now know that our team took the Driver and the Team Championships. And CCU was there to help.


