

2014 Marks 50 Years for CCU – A History

We are Corvette Owners! We are Corvette Enthusiasts! What is it that inspires our passion for the Corvette marque? What makes an Enthusiast?

This year, 2014, is a special landmark year for our Corvette Club of Utah. Fifty years ago a small group of Corvette devotees met together with an idea to form a new car club. It was a group of no more than half dozen charter members who would go on to form that association. For that club to go on for fifty plus years was not even on the minds of those charter members. The questions then on their minds were, how to get the word out to potential members, where to hold meetings, how much to ask for annual dues, what kind of activities will members want in order to enjoy this relatively new American sports car? Our Corvette club logo and patch was created with copyright at this time.





A few names are prominent among those original members; among those are John Kennedy and Sergei Liston, Jim and Viglnette Rousey, Paul Cummings, Jan Burch, Donald Plaque, Dale Larsen and Scott Madsen. John Kennedy in particular stands out among the charter members. John was the club's first president who, up until his death in September, 2011 remained the only active charter member of the Corvette Club of Utah. He became an Honorary Member. And for us early members, who could forget those after-meeting cruises down Foothill Blvd. for socials at the Cardinal Lounge at 4th South and Main next to Streator Chevrolet? Later, our club acquired dealership sponsors of such fine names as Young Chevrolet, Gus



Paulos Chevrolet and Larry H. Miller Chevrolet. In those early years the club held Auto Cross events at Dirk's Field parking lot on 13th south in SLC and at the JC Penny's in Centerville. There were a series of highly successful car shows including the well-remembered Corvette Classic in Park City, the Big Sky Corvette Meet in Montana and the famous Spaghetti Dinners with fellow car clubs, a financially beneficial idea

encouraged by John Kennedy. Our club's Corvettes were even featured in a TV commercial for AC Spark Plugs which was filmed on the Utah Salt Flats in 1967. In 1984, then CCU club sponsor Gus Paulos Chevrolet hosted an unveiling of the brand new 1984 C4 Corvette beside the pool at the Salt Lake Airport Hilton Hotel. The club members were aghast at the new look of the Corvette. The new aerodynamic design and the digital instrumentation were new and unique. These were the days when you *always* gave a wave to another

Corvette.

Our Corvette club was for many vears a full voting member club of the Western States Corvette Council (WSCC). Through the WSCC we hosted and participated in the Auto Cross events mentioned above. Corvette car shows and we interacted with other Corvette clubs throughout the western states. In 1976 our club even hosted the 11th Annual WSCC Convention. These three day events are held every year still and we have a select few CCU members who have re-joined WSCC. Through their membership they receive information related to all things Corvette and subscribe to the Quarterly *Redline* magazine. A caravan of our members attended the convention in Las Vegas, Nevada in May 2010. It was three days of food, car shows, drag racing at the 'Vegas raceway, more food, raffles, games and socializing



with Corvette enthusiasts from around the western states.

Like the Corvette automobile itself, our club is still going strong and we now have, on average, a larger membership than at any time in the past. Now we enjoy our beautiful Fiberglas babies on lengthy road trips to all parts of the U.S. Every year the club participates in many car shows, parades and charity events and we support our prominent Utah charity, the Utah Food Bank.

We all enjoy this strong association because of those early visionaries who had an intense appreciation for the Corvette sports car. There are so many names of members

who have, and continue to contribute to those accomplishments. Foremost we must acknowledge our many Board Officers who have unselfishly served throughout the years including those officers serving today. These members use their precious time and many skills for the betterment of our association. The membership thanks these individuals. And to those contributing members, not officers, of whom there are too many to name we say thanks.

The Corvette Club of Utah members are proud of our association and our accomplishments both individually and as a club. It may seem strange to consider the next 50 years but some of us here today may actually live to see it. Congratulations Corvette Club of Utah and, *Remember the <u>Wave</u>*!
