Corvette Production Stats Released by GM

In its latest quarterly issue of *America's Sports Car* magazine the National Corvette Museum published the General Motors, Chevrolet Motor Division final statistics on Corvette production for 2017. They report that there was a total of 32,782 2017 model Corvettes built. 34.3 % were Stingray Coupes, 30.2% Grand Sport Coupes, 18.9% Z06 Coupes, 7% Stingray Convertibles, 6.2% Grand Sport Convertibles and 3.3% Z06 Convertibles.

The 8 speed paddle shift automatic out produced the production of manual 7 speed transmissions coming in at 77%. The 1LT options package took the lead over other packages for Stingrays and Grand Sports and the 3LZ package dominated the Z06 production.

What would you think was the most popular color? It was Arctic White at 18%. Next came Watkins Glen Gray at 17.7%, Black 16%, Torch Red 14%, Admiral Blue 9%, Blade Silver 6%, Long Beach Red 6%, Corvette Racing Yellow at 4%, Black Rose 4% and Sterling Blue 2%. The magazine also pointed out that if you add the two reds together 'red' would be the most prominent color with 20%.

Speaking of Corvette History Trivia



If you are like me, questions about Corvette history sometimes come to mind. One question I had was about the material that our corvettes are made of, specifically 'fiberglass'. I knew that the early Corvettes were made of fiberglass and I also knew that our

Corvettes of today are not. Today, they are made of a complex recipe of modern plastic composites, aka, sheet-molded compound (SMC). So, I wondered, when did this transition take place? When was the last Corvette made of the real (fiberglass) stuff?

The question wasn't too hard to answer thanks to Google. I found an article, originally published in August 2011 by Barry Kluczyk that satisfied my curiosity. The article is like 12 pages long and it's loaded with facts on Corvette construction materials and methods (see the link below). So, anyway, rather than me trying to explain this rather convoluted subject I'd like to take a paragraph or two right from the actual article, I quote:

"Starting with the C3 generation in 1968, body parts were manufactured with a press-mold process, whereby the fiberglass material and resin were shaped in a die-like tool that produced smoother parts more quickly. It was a significant jump in forming technology and laid the groundwork for a change in the body panels' material in 1973. That year, the composition changed from conventional fiberglass to sheet-molded compound (SMC), which was composed of fiberglass, resin, and a catalyst formed under high heat and pressure. The ratio of resin to fiberglass was reduced with SMC, while the fiberglass itself was a bit coarser. The new material helped produce panels that were even smoother right out of the mold, meaning they required less surface finishing prior to painting. It also helped create a better final paint finish."


I also learned that with continued improvement of the chemical composition of SMC Chevrolet was able to produce stronger body panels

with greater strength and less weight which was an advantage given the lower horsepower engines in the late 1970s and early 1980s.

drive your choice of automatic or manual Z51 Corvette on the track with a pace car for four laps. The cost of Corvette Touring is \$199 and calling ahead to schedule recommended.

On top of the Corvette Experience and Corvette Touring, the National Corvette Museum is now offering **rides in Corvettes**. For \$20, you can take a three-mile, 10-15 minute ride in your choice of Corvette — 1966 Rally Red Convertible 327, 1979 Corvette Red Coupe and a 2003 50th Anniversary Convertible. With over 1.5 miles of frontage on Interstate 65 and located across from the National Corvette Museum and the General Motors Corvette Assembly Plant, the NCM Motorsports Park is one of the most centrally located and easily accessible driving facilities in the country.

2019 National Corvette Caravan

Often referred to as the world's largest moving automotive event, the National Corvette Caravan is a celebration of America's Sports Car, culminating in Bowling Green, Kentucky for the anniversary celebration of the National Corvette Museum. Hosted only once every five years, the next event is slated for Labor Day Weekend 2019 and will mark the Museum's 25th Anniversary. Leading the charge will be Jeffrey Duda of Hainesport, NJ, a Lifetime Member of the Museum and previous cocaptain of the New Jersey 2014 and 2009 Caravans.

The 6th National Corvette Caravan is slated for August 28-31, 2019. Regional caravans will form and join other caravans as they travel across the United States to meet in Bowling Green, Kentucky for four days of festivities at the National Corvette Museum. What can you expect from the 2019 National Corvette Caravan:

Registration for the caravan will occur on-line at the National Corvette Museum (NCM) website. If you are not a member of NCM, you will have to join NCM as part of the registration process. We will send out a notice when it's time to register.

Go to the Corvette Caravan Facebook page and join the group. This is how you will receive information regarding the caravan from NCM and our Captain.

Sign-up for a Corvette Factory Tour on the Thursday or Friday that you will be at the NCM. This is one of the highlights during the caravan. These go fast so sign-up early. The NCM website has a link to the factory tour reservations page.

About a year out, the Captain will release a list of hotels that the caravan will be stopping at. These will be in Cheyenne, WY, Lincoln, NC, and Columbia, MO. At the same time, CCU will release a list the name of the motel the club will be staying in at Bowling Green and a list of hotels for the journey home. Make your reservations early.

The Museum is located at I-65, exit 28 in South Central Kentucky and is open daily, 8am to 5pm Central Time.

Corvette Racing at Road America

DETROIT (Aug. 1, 2017) – Of all the tracks at which Corvette Racing has competed – 25 around the world – none may be as universally praised as Road America. It is where endurance racing's premier production-based team heads this weekend in hopes of building its points lead in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's GT Le Mans (GTLM) title race. Antonio Garcia and Jan Magnussen lead the Driver's Championship and Chevrolet heads the Manufacturer's standings with four races left.

The 4.048-mile, 14-turn circuit in the picturesque Kettle Moraine along Wisconsin's coast of Lake Michigan is a place where both Corvette Racing and Chevrolet have a deep history. Chevy leadership oftentimes used the track to test and reveal a number of high-performance production cars in the 1960s. The relationship between the track and brand is solidified by the landmark Corvette Bridge that competitors pass under each lap.

Corvette Racing has achieved a number of successes at Road America since its first race there in 2002... which ended in victory. There have been seven total at the track but perhaps none were as dramatic as last year's run to victory for Tommy Milner and Oliver Gavin. The pairing in

the No. 4 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R went from fifth to first with 15 minutes remaining to earn their fourth victory of the season en route to the GTLM Driver's, Manufacturer's and Team Championship.

This year, it's teammates Garcia and Magnussen who lead in points heading into the eighth race of the season. The pairing has won twice so far in the No. 3 Mobil 1/SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette C7.R and holds a slim seven-point lead with a maximum of 36 points available in Sunday's race.

They won races earlier this year at Sebring and Circuit of The Americas in addition to a third-place class finish at Watkins Glen. Garcia and Magnussen were second in class at Road America in 2013. Corvette Racing's group of four drivers has won seven times at Road America, led by Gavin with four victories and four pole positions.

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Diagnostic Problem: Oil Odor From The Engine With No Leaks

We'd been smelling oil at times while driving our Corvette. However, there were no drips, and the engine had been checked for leaks, with none found. Finally, we took our car to a dealer who was able to diagnose and solve the problem. The cause was the lube used on the rear main seal, not an oil leak. This problem is known to affect 2008-2013 Corvettes.

The recommendation for a proper diagnosis is as follows:

- 1. If an oil odor is detected, check for an external oil leak.
- 2. Check to be sure the engine oil level is not over full (Dry sump system be sure to follow Si procedure for checking the oil).
- 3. If no oil leaks were found and the engine oil level is not over full, replace the rear main seal.

This information was helpful to us, and I wanted to pass it along.

Continue on to Durango, CO via HWY 6 where we will spend the night at the Hampton Inn and Suites, 3777 Main Ave, Durango, CO. Hot breakfast is available. Rooms are reserved under the Corvette Club of Utah. Group rate for Standard King or Double Queen is \$139 + tax. For reservations call 970-247-2600. Reservations must be made by July 31st. Our block is released on August 1st.

Thursday, October 12th

This morning we travel to Pagosa Springs and then onto the Taos Pueblo. The Taos Pueblo is one of 19 pueblos in the state, and stands out as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. People have lived in Taos Pueblo's multi-storied adobe structures for more than 1,000 years. Here we will enjoy a guided tour and have lunch in Taos vicinity. Fees apply. After lunch we will follow the High Road to Santa Fe, traveling along back routes and taking in the colonial countryside of New Mexico's beginnings. From Santa Fe we'll travel to Albuquerque, where we will spend the next 3 nights at the Best Western Airport InnSuites. Rooms are reserved under the Corvette Club of Utah. Group rate for standard King (Double Queen, if available) is \$154 + tax. For reservations call 505-242-7022. Reservations must be made by July 31st. Our block is released on August 1st.

Friday, October, 13th

After Breakfast we head toward Santa Fe via the Turquoise Trail. The Scenic and Historic Area of the Turquoise Trail encompasses 15,000 square miles in the heart of central New Mexico, linking Albuquerque and Santa Fe. Enjoy a breathtaking view from atop Sandia Crest, then drive back into history through the mining towns of Golden, Madrid, and Cerrillos, now coming alive with art, crafts, theater, music, museums and restaurants. There's a great photo op at Maggie's Diner in Madrid from the movie Wild Hogs. Arrive in Santa Fe in time to see the city and have an early dinner before returning to Albuquerque to catch the Special Shapes Glowdeo and Laser Light Show. Evening Session admission tickets needed to enter the Balloon Fiesta Field. Note: Unless otherwise determined by our group, we will only see the balloon morning ascensions on Saturday and Sunday.

Saturday, October 14th

Today is an early day! We will be on the road by 5:00 AM or we will miss the morning ascension. Krispy Cremes and coffee will be available there. Also, our hotel may be opening breakfast earlier than 6:30 AM or make breakfast bags to go. TBD. This is an Albuquerque day. After touring thru the park we'll arrive in Cortez at the Holiday Inn Express, 2121 East Main St., Cortez, CO. Hot breakfast is available. Rooms are reserved under the Corvette Club of Utah. Group rate for all standard rooms (kings, queens, double queens, etc) is \$100 + tax. For reservations call 970–565-6000. Reservations must be made by July 31st. Our block is released on August 1st. Monday. October 16th

Leave for home via US-191 and US-6W. Lunch TBD.

Note: We have reserved 2 - 15 passenger vans to transport us to and from the Balloon Fiesta Field and into town as recommended by the hotel and visitor bureau. dinner was ready for us.






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
