CORVETTE RACING AT THE GLEN: HARD-FOUGHT WIN FOR GARCIA, TAYLOR

CORVETTE RACING AT THE GLEN: Hard-Fought Win for Garcia, Taylor

No. 3 Corvette takes season's second victory; Milner, Tandy charge derailed late in race

WATKINS GLEN, NY (June 27, 2021) – Corvette Racing returned to Victory Circle at Watkins Glen International on Sunday with a GT Le Mans (GTLM) victory for Antonio Garcia and Jordan Taylor in the Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen. They drove the No. 3 Mobil 1/ SiriusXM Chevrolet Corvette to a steamy and hard-fought triumph for the team's first win at Watkins Glen International since 2014.

Pole-winner Garcia won for the second time in the Six Hours while Taylor claimed his first victory in the event. The duo increased their lead in the IMSA WeatherTech SportsCar Championship's GTLM standings as they look to repeat their 2020 title.

The fight in the category looked like it would come down to a battle of the mid-engine Corvettes. Tommy Milner and Nick Tandy led a majority of the race in their No. 4 Mobil 1/ SiriusXM Corvette C8.R with Milner taking the lead on the opening lap. The two Corvettes swapped the lead eight times throughout the six hours and were first and second on a restart with a little less than 40 minutes to go.

Tandy, who held the lead through two pit stop cycles thanks to excellent pit work and car performance, held point when the race went back green but reported a mechanical issue that severely handicapped the No. 4 Corvette. He just missed out a podium finish for he and Milner.

That left Garcia to hold off John Edwards in the No. 24 GTLM entry over the last five laps. The two had to battle through class leaders in other categories, and Garcia held on for a 0.845-second winning margin.

Taylor drove a marathon two-hour, 30-minute stint in the middle of the race and swapped the lead with both Tandy and Milner during his time in the No. 3 Corvette. That left Garcia to drive his own tense, nail-biting triple stint to the finish.

Corvette Racing will be back in action at The Glen for the WeatherTech 240 on Friday, July 2. The race will air live at 6 p.m. ET on NBCSN and Trackpass via NBC Sports Gold. Live audio coverage of Thursday practice along with Friday's qualifying and the race from IMSA Radio is available on IMSA.com, XM 202 and SiriusXM Online 992.

Corvette Racing at Laguna Seca

The closest opportunity for the club to watch Corvette Racing in action is at the WeatherTech Raceway Laguna Seca near Monterey, CA. The IMSA schedule has change again, just like last year, and the Corvette's will be back at the track for the Hyundai Monterey Sports Car Championship on Sept 10-12th. This late in the game lodging will be expensive and hard to get.

We have organized a trip to watch the races and the details are on the club webpage. Prices have already started changing in Salinas and that will be the biggest challenge in going to the races. Get a room where you can and at a rate you can afford. We can meet up as a club at the hotel on the webpage or at the track each day. When you book a room, make sure you are getting a refundable rate.

Tickets are on sale at Laguna Seca through Ticket Master at https:// www.co.monterey.ca.us/government/ government-links/weathertech-raceway/ ticket-information. You will need a 3-Day General Admission & Paddock ticket which will cost \$90 per person. This ticket you download to your phone or print it out and bring it with you. You will also need a Corvette Corral Ticket which will cost you \$150 for the driver and \$125 for your passenger. This will give you access to the corral parking, the corral tent, the Corvette Parade Lap on the track, a gift bag, food, and drink at the Corvette Corral. These tickets will be mailed to you. I suspect they will be wrist bands.

The track has taken over the corral physical setup and sets the prices for the corral. They are trying to make it a premium experience and have added food and beverage service at the corral. The Western States Corvette Council and GM will still arrange for the normal corral speakers and activities. If you still want to go to the races but don't want to pay for the corral experience you can also buy a Preferred Parking ticket for \$40 which allows you to park at the lakebed near the car corrals but you will not be allowed to park with or participate in the Corvette Corral Activities.

ALBUQUERQUE INTERNATIONAL BALLOON FIESTA

October 4—October 9, 2021

For nine days in October, the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta creates an enchanted world of special-shaped balloon rodeos, twilight balloon glows, and vibrant balloon filled skies. Brisk autumn mornings in the Rio Grande Valley create an otherworldly backdrop for the breathtaking majesty this most popular event, the Mass Ascension of the Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta. The event began with 13 balloons in 1972 and today is the largest hot air ballooning event in the world. Join Steve and Karen DeSmet as they enjoy early morning and evening balloon events, as well as touring thru some of New Mexico's most scenic byways and historic towns.

Day 1: Monday, October 4

Meet at Thanksgiving Point in Lehi for drivers meeting at 8:45 AM, departing at 9:00 AM for lunch at the Moab Diner. We'll be staying at the Holiday Inn Express in Farmington, NM. Call 505-325-2545 for reservations booked under Corvette Club of Utah; 12 kings available at \$80 + tax. Free hot breakfast is served in the lobby 5:00 -7:30 AM; self-serve after 7:30 AM.

Day 2: Tuesday, October 5 Leave for Albuquerque via Grants, where we will see iconic Route 66 sites before going to the Pueblo of Acoma. It is the gateway to Acoma "Sky City," part of New Mexico's cultural heritage, as the oldest continuously inhabited settlement in North America. Acoma history is also the story of the Southwest, from its initial role as the home to the Anasazi people, to the thirteenth century founding of the Pueblo, which is still alive and well as a community and touchstone for Native Americans in the area and nationwide. We'll be staying at the Best Western Airport Albuquerque. Call 505-242-7022for reservations booked under the Corvette Club of Utah; 12 kings available at \$169 + tax. Hot breakfast included. Dinner is at the Country Line BBQ, with a ride after on the Sandia Peak Tram, America's longest aerial tramway. Once atop the peak, the view is a panorama of Albuquerque's night lights below.

Day 3: Wednesday, October 6
Rise 'n shine! We'll be on the
field bright and early for the
Dawn Patrol Show at 6:00 AM.

Dawn Patrol pilots take off in the dark and fly until it is light enough to see landing sites. Fellow balloonists appreciate the Dawn Patrol because they can watch the balloons and get an early idea of wind speeds and directions at different altitudes.

This is followed by the Krispy Crème Morning Glow at 6:30 AM. Next at 7:00 AM, pilots from around the globe will be participating in the Flight of the Nations Mass Ascension followed by the Remote Controlled Balloons exhibition. We'll return to the hotel for a rest, and then head out to explore Historical Albuquerque and have lunch. Dinner is at the Route 66 Diner, followed by a cruise through the heart of the city along Central Avenue. This historic highway leads travelers through some of the city's most beloved neighborhoods and by many Route 66 landmarks ending at the Route 66 Casino and Hotel.

Day 4: Thursday, October 7
We get to sleep in today! We will venture out to explore the
Turquoise Trail after breakfast at the hotel. This includes exploring
Santa Fe, New Mexico's capital

city known for its relaxed pace, stimulating culture, fantastic food, historic architecture, and charming stores. Lunch to be determined. After lunch we will visit Madrid, where Wild Hogs was filmed, and travel the trail back to Albuquerque. We'll park the Vettes, get in the vans and head to dinner at El Pinto for dinner just 15 minutes from the balloon fiesta field. Our evening session on the field includes the Shape Glowdeo followed by the AfterGlow Fireworks show.

Day 5: Friday, October 8

We say goodbye to Albuquerque and began our drive home. Lunch is in Chama, NM, home of the Cumbres & Toltec Railroad. Ride on the Chama High Noon, half day train trip with a bag lunch from one of the local restaurants.

We'll spend the night in Durango at the Hampton Inn. Call 970-247-2600 for reservations booked under Corvette Club of Utah; 8 kings and 4 queens available at \$119 + tax. Hostess served hot continental breakfast from 6:00 – 9:00 AM.

Day 6: Saturday, October 9

Leave for home thru picturesque countryside on our way to Pagosa Springs, CO. Lunch to be determined. After lunch we will head home.

Additional costs:

- Acoma Pueblo Sky City tour Adult \$25 + tax; seniors \$22 + tax
- Balloon Fiesta admission: \$15 per person for each of the 2 sessions; tickets available in July at 855-725-1824 or balloonfiesa.com
- Van rental for nighttime activities and Balloon Fiesta Field is approximately \$60 per person plus gas. Please note that each van has seating for 12; we will need a second driver for a larger group.
- Sandia Peak Tramway round trip tickets: Adult 21-61 \$29; seniors
 62 up \$24
- Cumbres and Toltec Railroad experience: Coach \$95; group rate available for 20 or more.

Note: October gets chilly at night so bring some warm clothes, and folding chairs, so you don't sit on the grass. And don't forget your cameras!

2024 Corvette Caravan

The National Corvette Museum (NCM) has announced that the 2024 Corvette Caravan activities will occur on Aug 29th through Aug 31st at the Museum. For those of you not familiar with the caravan, every five years Corvette Owners from around the world travel in caravans back to the museum in Bowling Green.

In 2014 and 2019 the club traveled with the Northern California, Nevada, and Utah Caravan to Bowling Green. In previous years we have traveled by ourselves. I frequently hear from members that they would like to participate but two weeks is too long to be away from work.

For 2024, I'm proposing that Corvette Club of Utah leave on Saturday before the caravan arrives in Utah and arrive at Bowling Green on Monday Night. This would give us Tuesday and Wednesday to visit local sites and take in tour at the Corvette Assembly Plant. We would then visit the NCM on Thursday, get our caravan credentials, t-shirt and watch the caravan's arrive. We could even meet up with our caravan if you want to join the traffic jam. We could also participate in the caravan activities on Friday to include the exhibits, laps at the motorsports park, and the closing concert at the NCM. Yes you would still have to register for the caravan through the NCM. On Saturday, we would skip the NCM Anniversary Celebration and head home arriving in SLC on Monday, Labor Day, that evening. You would only have to take 5 days off of work to see the Museum and the Factory.
