

SINKHOLE COLLAPSES AT NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM

We received a call at 5:44am from our security company alerting us of our motion detectors going off in our Skydome area of the Museum. Upon arrival it was discovered that a sinkhole had collapsed within the Museum. No one was in or around the Museum at the time. The Bowling Green Fire Department arrived on the scene and secured the area. The Fire Department has estimated the size of the hole is 40 feet across and 25-30 feet deep.



It is with heavy hearts that we report that eight Corvettes were affected by this incident. Those cars include:

1993 ZR-1 Spyder on loan from General Motors

2009 ZR1 "Blue Devil" on loan from General Motors

The other six vehicles were owned by the National Corvette Museum including:

1962 Black Corvette

1984 PPG Pace Car

1992 White 1 Millionth Corvette

1993 Ruby Red 40th Anniversary Corvette

2001 Mallett Hammer Z06 Corvette


2009 White 1.5 Millionth Corvette

None of the cars affected were on loan from individuals. The Skydome exhibit area of the Museum is a separate structure connected to the main Museum. A structural engineer is now on-site to assess the existing damage and stability of the surrounding areas. The Museum is closed to the public for the day to allow us to carefully assess the situation. We will keep everyone informed as we know more.

With the 20th Anniversary celebration, Grand Opening of the NCM Motorsports Park, and the National Corvette Caravan coming August 27-30, we've got a lot to be excited about in 2014, and look forward to getting the Skydome repaired and reopened very soon.

CHEVROLET TO OVERSEE RESTORATION OF HISTORIC CORVETTES

DETROIT – To help the National Corvette Museum recover from the massive sink hole, Chevrolet will be overseeing restoration of the Corvettes damaged. The process will be managed by General Motors Design in Warren, Mich.



The vehicles at the National Corvette Museum are some of the most significant in automotive history," said Mark Reuss, executive vice president of General Motors Global Product Development. "There can only be one 1-millionth Corvette ever built. We want to ensure as many of the damaged cars are restored as possible so fans from around the world can enjoy them when the Museum reopens."

The restoration will be overseen by Ed Welburn, vice president of GM Global Design.

When the cars are recovered, they will be shipped to the Mechanical Assembly facility, a small specialty shop within GM Design, where the best restoration approach will be determined. Mechanical Assembly has been part of GM Design since the 1930s, and today maintains and restores many of the vehicles in the GM Heritage Collection and GM's historic concept cars.

TUDOR UNITED SPORTSCAR RACING

WILL REPLACE THE AMERICAN LE MANS SERIES



In 1999 the American Le Mans sports car series ran its first season. The ALMS series of sports car racing was the brain child of Dr. Don Panoz who wanted to bring the excitement and glamor of European racing to

America. He was more than successful. The American Le Mans endurance series was based in the United States and Canada and hosted such renowned automobile marques as Porsche, Ferrari, Aston Martin, BMW, Audi and certainly our favorite the Chevrolet Corvette. Accolades can be heaped upon the 15 years of accredited racing successes achieved through the ALMS series. In

the past, many of our CCU members took the opportunity to attend some of the races not only at our own local Miller Motorsports Park but also at the famous Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca in Monterey, and Infineon Raceway-Sears Point in Sonoma, California. Here at home many of our CCU members participated with our Corvette Racing Team at the GM sponsored Corvette Corrals, and we hosted the race teams in the corral tents. This was a labor of love for us all. We thank the members who gave time and effort to make the corrals a big success.



Now, as with everything, American sports car racing is evolving. The newly announced Tudor United SportsCar Championship Series will replace the ALMS. On September 5, 2012 it was announced that the Grand-Am Road Racing sanctioning body would merge with the Braselton based International Motor Sports

Association (IMSA), and as such both bodies would combine their premiere sports car series, the Rolex Sports Car Series and American Le Mans Series respectively, with plans to debut a new series schedule in 2014.

In January 2013, the two racing series' announced a preliminary class structure for the new program. Grand-Am's Daytona Prototype category and IMSA's P2 would combine into a single class, with allowances for the unique Delta Wing to also compete in this new class. The Le Mans Prototype Challenge class of single spec cars from the American Le Mans Series would continue, although the cars will switch to using Grand-Am's Continental Tires. The GT class of the American Le Mans Series, which includes Corvette, would remain unchanged, while Grand-Am's GT class will form another GT class, to be combined with the American Le Mans GTC category. The only category of cars not represented in the new series is the American Le Mans Prototype 1 (P1).

There are four different classes in the United SportsCar Championship Series, featuring two sports prototype categories and two [grand tourer](#) classes:

Prototype (P): the flagship class, combining Grand-Am Daytona Prototype with the American Le Mans Series P2 prototype and [DeltaWing](#) cars, built to 2013 specifications.

Prototype Challenge (PC): a spec class carried over directly from the American Le Mans Series, featuring Le Mans Prototype Challenge cars built by [Oreca](#) with engines supplied by Chevrolet and tires from Continental.

GT Le Mans (GTM): a continuation of the ALMS GT class, consisting of cars matching the Automobile Club de l'Ouest's GTE specification.

GT Daytona (GTD): a class that combines the Grand-Am GT & GX classes with the Porsche 911 GT3 Cup cars from the ALMS GTC class. Group GT3 cars will be allowed entry into this class.

CCU SPRING BREAK CRUISE – 5-13 APR 2014

Several years ago, the club took a trip to Death Valley in the early spring. Yes, it snowed on us when we left, but we made it over the pass at Eureka and had a marvelous time thawing out after a long, cold winter. We are going to repeat this adventure, but this time we are heading south to San Diego and Palm Springs for a full week of thawing out. Break out the Corvette's, this is a Corvette trip. Before you leave, you can save some money by buying the [San Diego 3 for 1 Park Pass](#) for \$143. This admits one adult to all three parks for 7 days. You can also purchase it through [Costco](#) for \$112.99.

Saturday, April 5th – 9:00 AM Depart from Thanksgiving Point (East) front parking lot. This may be a big group so we may split up into smaller groups if needed. The show will start at 11:00 AM and end at 3:00 PM.



The factory is holding firm that due to the new factory layout and increased safety concerns, they cannot allow self-guided tours as they did in 2009.


