#### CCU Poker Run - Saturday, June 10th

Come join us on Saturday, Jun 10th for a fun day on the CCU Poker Run. Meet at the old K-Mart building in West Jordan at 1442 W 9000 S. Members can start purchasing poker hands at 8:15 am. Cost will be \$5.00/hand/person. We will draw our first card here before starting. We will be leaving at 9:00 am.

The route will be approximately 135 miles. We suspect 60% or more of those attending have not taken this route before. We will head west on 90th S. to the Mountain View Corridor, north to 5400 South, west to Bacchus Highway, north to Magna and then west on 2400 south to I-80 via Saltair cut-off (state highway 202), west on I-80 and exit at Lake Point.

We will draw our second card at the Flying J. If members from the north want to save some mileage you can meet us here and buy your poker hand and draw two cards. Great time for a restroom stop and treats because we will not see restrooms again until we reach Tooele (125 miles from now).

From here we head west on I-80 (for those that don't know I-80 is also known as the Lincoln Highway and nope we are not headed to Wendover). We will exit off I-80 at the Dugway on State Highway 196 (Skull Valley Road). We will draw card #3 here.

WARNING: watch for cattle and antelope. We can't enter Dugway because it's a military base, I know because I tried.

At the LDS church we will head east and a few miles up the road we will enter the old Lincoln Highway (for some interesting reading google Old Lincoln Highway). At the crest of the divide we will stop and draw card #4 and allow a little time so everyone can read the plaque on the history of the highway.

Back on the road we will head down off the divide. At State Highway 36 we will head north to Tooele where we will draw card #5 in at Joann Fabric parking lot, 852 N. Main Street hopefully around noon to 1pm.

#### Mike Barker's CCU TRIVIA

- When was the first mid-engine Corvette introduced (year)? What was it called? Who introduced it? And where was it unveiled? ANSWER: 1986, called the CERV 1, introduced by Zora Arkus-Dontov and it was unveiled at Riverside International Raceway
- Back when Chevrolet was not into racing, Zora Duntov created a Corvette to compete with the Ford Cobra 427 S/C and the GT 40's. What was the Corvette called? And what year was it produced?

ANSWER: Grand Sport 1963

3. In what year did Corvette produce cars in two different cities? What cities?

ANSWER: 1981---St. Louis and Bowling Green. St. Louis plant. (The St. Louis plant used lacquer based paint and Bowling Green plant used enamel basecoat with clear topcoat. St. Louis primarily did solid colored Vettes while the Bowling Green plant did two tone paint jobs. Bowling Green plant was just getting up and running and overlooked keeping records so we have no idea how many cars were painted with the two tone colors. Colors painted were: silver/dark blue, silver/charcoal, beige/dark bronze and autumn red/dark claret.

- 4. Three things were quite unique about this year of production what were they? ANSWER: Three thing quite unique about the 1981 Corvette. (1) Only year the Corvette was produced in two different plants. (2) Power seats became available for the first time. (3) Only year that only one engine option was available it was the base 350ci, 190hp L81
- What one thing is unique about the 1981 Corvette?
   ANSWER: Last year for the pure 4-speed transmission. Was the last year for a manual transmission until mid-year 1984.
