<u>Friday, 14 September</u>. The South Members will gather at the Smith's Parking Lot on 650 West 5300 South (just two blocks west of I-15) at 8:00a.m. and rendezvous with the North members at the Flying J Gas Station in Perry, Exit Number 362 on I-15. Departure from the Flying J will commence at 9:15a.m SHARP!


